Interested in Full-Time

- * Contact your school counselor

Interested in Part-Time

- * Students must discuss plans with their school counselor.
- * Counselor will recommend classes and forward information to E.B. Wilson.
- * Student and parent will attend registration night at E.B. Wilson.

Other Information

- * Students must begin classes on site at E.B. Wilson for 1st 4 1/2 weeks.
- * All tests are taken at E.B. Wilson with a certified teacher.
- * Transportation is the responsibility of the student/family.
- * There is a nominal tuition to attend E.B. Wilson
- * Though not essential, it is helpful if students have access to an internet-accessible computer beyond E. B. Wilson.

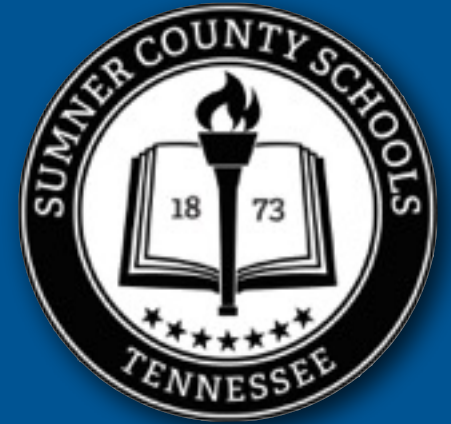

**Sumner County Middle College

Located on the Volunteer State Community College campus, MCHS is a collaborative effort between Sumner County Schools and Volunteer State Community College.

Students must take the ACT to be eligible to apply for the Middle College High School. A composite of 19 or higher with subtests of at least 19 in reading, 18 in English, and 19 in math are required.

Students must have at least 10 high school credits to be eligible. The Middle College High School is a program for juniors and seniors who are motivated, hardworking, responsible, and driven.

The potential to graduate high school and receive an associate's degree at the same time is an opportunity available for the student who has a strong work ethic and never misses an assignment or class. Who?

What?

Students spend their mornings in the university setting and return to their high schools in the afternoon for the last two blocks.

How?

GPA 3.0 or above
ACT Composite of 22 with a minimum of 19 in all areas
Principal and teacher recommendations
Agree to enroll in fall and spring semesters for a total of 9 hours
Participate in an interview with school officials

Fees?

Earn college credits at a discounted rate: Students pay \$1,650 per semester (\$250 per credit hour)
Textbooks are included in the tuition.
